

SECOND EXAM STUDY GUIDE

Bio 106

Spring 2012

The test will be 85 Points in total. Anything we have discussed in class or in your book is fair game for the test.

Please pay attention to what time you need to be here. Students arriving late to class will not be allowed extra time.

This should go without saying, but do not cheat. Academic honesty is taken extremely seriously on this and all occasions. There are seen and unseen forces working to ensure that you do not cheat. If you don't want a zero on the test and most likely in the class, keep your eyes on your own paper.

A quick note – read over your test when you're done. If your answers aren't in complete sentences or look like something you would see in a text message on a phone, you're doing it wrong.

The test is split into three parts:

Part 1 – Definitions (25 Points):

You will be presented with seven terms of which you will be asked to define five. I will grade the first five you answer, so answering more will not help you. These definitions should be concise but complete. I expect answers to be roughly 2-3 sentences long. Anything goes here, but a quick look in your book's review section will identify many important terms that would be a good baseline for study.

Part 2 – Short Answer (30 Points):

Short questions from each chapter can be found here. You will answer six of eight of the questions. Again, I will grade the first six you answer; answering more will not help you. Your review section in the book as well as the slides are the best places to study for this.

Part 3 – Essay (30 Points):

There will be three questions on this section, worth 15 points each. Pick two to answer. This section will test your ability to assemble concepts and ideas on a larger scale and relate them back to me. I ask that you use complete sentences and structure your responses. Please make a special effort to use correct spelling and grammar.
